



## Admission Guidelines

Thank-you for considering KIS as the school for your child's education. This is an important decision that you should consider carefully as it will affect your child's educational path. Applications for admissions are accepted at any time. Kyoto International School exists primarily to serve the needs of international families who reside in the Kansai area and have a clear need for an English based education. Kyoto International School does not have the resources to serve the child with learning disabilities. Admissions and class placement will be decided by the Head of School based on space available, primarily by age, and also of language balance of the grade level in question, past student achievement and motivation, language support at home and prospects of learning successfully in the school. Kyoto International School seeks motivated students who will be able to succeed in a challenging and well-rounded program. Entry is guaranteed only on receipt of the registration fee. This fee is not refundable.

Preschool applicants must be at least three years old before September 1 of the entering year. Pre-K applicants must be four, Kindergarten applicants must be five, and so on up to grade 8. Children may be admitted regardless of their English proficiency, however as the applicant moves up the grades the standard of English sufficient to permit him/her to follow the academic course at his/her grade level becomes more important. An important factor with admissions is the consideration of whether the child is a good match for the program and can be successful at KIS. Availability of seats and the balance of languages within a class is also a consideration.

## What You Need

Your application will not be complete until the school has received the following items.

For Preschool applicant: 1~6,

For Pre-K and Kindergarten applicant: 1~8,

For Grade 1 and up applicant: 1~9

1. Admission Form completed and signed
2. One passport-size photo for each applicant (Paste on the application form)
3. One family photo.
4. Photocopy of passport, birth certificate or health insurance card (to certify date of birth)
5. Completed Health Form (by a physician and parent)
6. Application fee of 20,000 yen
7. Confidential Student Recommendation (to be filled out by applicant's teacher)
8. Transcript/School Records for the past 2 years and the current school year
9. Any standardized test results (IOWA, ISA, ERB, etc.)

## Interview and Assessment

These should be directly mailed or delivered to the KIS Office. Upon receipt of the above, the student's records will be assessed by the school admission committee. You will then be contacted and an interview will be arranged or declined. All students seeking admission to Kyoto International School must be interviewed before a final decision on admission is made. Part of the interview process will include an observational visit to the classroom as well as completion of required level tests for grade one and up. As a part of the admissions process Kyoto International School requires that both parents, when available, meet with the Head of School to discuss their child's educational needs.

Normally parents can expect a decision within a week after the admissions screening. In the event that insufficient records are presented, admission appointments or decisions will be delayed.

\*For Preschool parents, normally notification of acceptance will be announced at the end of May for the following school year.



## Deferred Acceptance

In the case of applicants residing outside Japan, or in cases where professional assessment is required, notification of acceptance may be deferred until after the interview with the student and the student's parents or the completion of required tests. In these cases, space will be held for possible admission, until after completion of the interview or the required assessments.

## Registration Fee

Registration fee is a one-time fee, and is non-refundable.  
Preschool through grade 8 - ¥150,000

## Tuition and Supplementary Fees

Tuition and supplementary fees are charged by the term, and are non-refundable.  
The term rate for tuition and fees for 2008-2009 is shown in the table below.

## Payment of Fees

Fees are due by the first day of class each term.

Cheques drawn on foreign accounts will be liable for transfer charges.  
Payments by wire transfer from overseas need to have ¥2,500 added to cover wire transfer fees.  
Accounts overdue shall be billed a surcharge of ¥20,000 per month, cumulative.  
School policy prohibits class attendance, or the release of records or reports, in cases of serious financial delinquency.  
Pupils entering KIS after the commencement of the term may be charged a pro-rated amount for that term.

- In the best interests of the individual, in serious cases where the student is not able to successfully keep up with the requirements of his/her grade level, the student may be asked to repeat the grade level, or in more serious cases, the School may request the student to be transferred to another educational institution, where he or she may be more successful.
  - Parents should be reminded that if a child with Japanese nationality enters the school from grade one and up that they are opting out of the Japanese educational system as set out by the government. It is required by law to obtain an official permit from the Japanese Board of Education allowing him/her to be released. Parents must note that it is solely their responsibility to meet the necessary requirements with the government to this end. All children holding Japanese nationality are also required to be registered in their local Japanese school, even if they have been accepted into the Kyoto International School.
  - One month notice in writing, must be given before a pupil is withdrawn, or the following term's fees will be payable. Pupils withdrawing mid-term are not eligible for a refund of tuition or fees.
  - Parents or guardians of the students assume full responsibility for all school fees and understand that all fees are non-refundable.
